CLOSING - All Southbound Turnpike lanes at Kendall Drive

To be closed nightly from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, April 17 through Thursday, April 20.

FORT LAUDERDALE —The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has scheduled full closures on southbound Turnpike to allow crews to install overhead sign structures. In order to perform this work safely, traffic will be detoured during the following dates and times:

- **All southbound lanes on Florida's Turnpike between the Snapper Creek Service Plaza and Southwest 120th Street** will be closed from 11 p.m. Monday, April 17 to 5 a.m., Tuesday, April 18. Motorists will be directed through a secondary road in the Snapper Creek Service Plaza back onto the Turnpike at the Southwest 120th Street entry ramp. If necessary to complete the work, these lane closures will also take place from 11 p.m. Tuesday, April 18 to 5 a.m. Wednesday, April 19.
- **All southbound lanes on Florida's Turnpike between Kendall Drive/Southwest 88th Street and Southwest 120th Street** will be closed nightly from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. Tuesday, April 18 through Thursday, April 20. Motorists will be directed to exit at Southwest 88th Street/Kendall Drive and travel east on Kendall Drive to continue south on Southwest 117th Avenue to Southwest 120th Street to re-enter southbound Florida's Turnpike.
- **The ramps to southbound Turnpike from eastbound and westbound Kendall Drive/Southwest 88th Street** will also be closed nightly from 10:30 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, April 17 through Thursday, April 20. Motorists will be directed to travel south on Southwest 117th Avenue to Southwest 120th Street to re-enter southbound Florida's Turnpike.

This work is part of the Turnpike's ongoing \$145.3 million widening project on Florida's Turnpike between Eureka Drive/SW 184th Street to Killian Parkway/SW 104th Street. Please note, this schedule may change due to inclement weather or other unexpected conditions.
