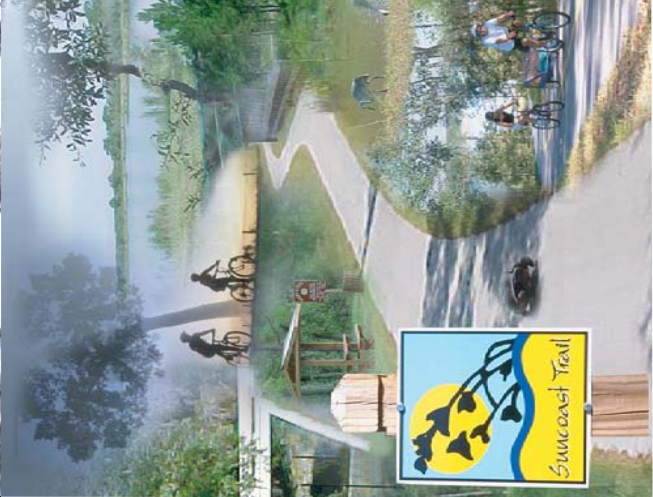


The Suncoast Trail is a 42-mile paved, shared-use path owned by Florida's Department of Transportation, Turnpike Enterprise, and operated and maintained by the Hillsborough, Pasco, and Hernando Counties Parks and Recreation Departments. Beginning in northern Hillsborough County, the Trail passes alongside 10 miles of conservation area in Pasco County, through Oak Pine, and Sandhill habitats, and into the rolling terrain of northern Hernando County.

The Suncoast Trail provides for alternative travel modes through developing urban areas and increases statewide interconnectivity of recreation and nature facilities. Plans are in progress to link the Trail to the Upper Tampa Bay Trail to the south and the Goka Neighbor Trail, Withalcochee State Trail, Cross Florida Greenway, and Lake County Heritage Trail to the north and east.



The Suncoast Trail represents a concerted effort among governmental entities to provide connections between people and their communities. The Trail has been designated by the White House Millennium Council as a Millennium Trail and the National Park Service as a National Recreation Trail, and has also been added to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's System of Greenways and Trails.

Refer to the rules and map provided in this Trail Guide to plan your trip. In case of emergency, dial 9-1-1 and state your location in terms of the Trail Miles shown in the accompanying table. Whether you're walking, running, e-biking, or bicycling, we welcome you to experience some of the Central Gulf Coast region's most beautiful landscapes as part of your travel, fitness, and leisure activities.
