Central and West Central Florida Weekly Lane Closures and Work Zone Advisory

OCOOE, FL (January 9, 2009) — Florida's Turnpike announces lane closures and work zone information for construction and maintenance projects in Central Florida **beginning Sunday, January 11, 2009.**

Florida's Turnpike strives to maintain traffic flow in work zones; however, motorists may encounter heavier traffic near construction sites. Motorists should drive with caution through the work zones, and adhere to posted detour signs and speed limits. Speeding fines double in construction zones when workers are present. **All paving-related lane closures are dependent on weather conditions; rain or temperatures below 65 degrees may delay or cancel paving operations.**



Turnpike Mainline ORANGE COUNTY

TURNPIKE WIDENING PROJECT—INTERSTATE 4 TO GOTHA ROAD (MILEPOSTS 259-265)

- Expect single lane closures north and south bound between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m., along with pacing operations between the hours of midnight and 5 a.m. This night work is for the demolition and removal of the old SR 50 connector bridge.
- Motorist should be alert for construction vehicles entering and exiting traffic at several locations along the project.
- Be alert for lane shifts, both north- and southbound through the project limits, especially those near the SR 408 ramp to northbound Turnpike.
- Construction activities continue from the I-4 bridges to north of the Turkey Lake Service Plaza at Gotha Rd.
- Motorists on Kirkman Road should be alert for single lane closures in both directions between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m., Mondays through Thursdays, and 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. on Sundays.
- Motorists should be alert for nightly closures in both directions on Apopka-Vineland.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This \$128.6 million project adds two lanes in each direction between Interstate 4 and the SR 408 Interchange. Construction includes widening the existing bridges over Interstate 4 and Apopka-Vineland Road, and replacing the Kirkman Road and Gotha Road bridges over the Turnpike. Additionally, improvements will be made at the Interstate 4 and SR 408 (East-West Expressway) interchanges. This project is scheduled to be

TURNPIKE WIDENING PROJECT – SR. 408 TO NORTH OF BEULAH ROAD (MILEPOST 265-270)

- Watch for construction vehicles entering and exiting traffic at locations along the project.
- Be aware of the single laning on the State Road 50 Connector Rd. and the merging traffic at the on- and off-ramps.
- Be alert for lane shifts in both directions on the Turnpike as well as the northbound ramps from SR 408.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This \$68.8 million project consists of widening of Florida's turnpike (SR 91) from four to eight lanes and six to 12 lanes from milepost 266 to milepost 269 in Orange County. The construction includes widening of the bridges over Beulah Rd. and reconstruction of the State Road 50 connector bridge over Florida's Turnpike, resurfacing existing pavement, construction of storm water retention ponds, signing and marking, lighting, landscaping, sound barriers, ITS and utilities. This project is expected to be complete in August 2010.

TURNPIKE WIDENING PROJECT—BEULAH ROAD TO STATE ROAD 50 (MILEPOSTS 270-273)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This \$123.5 million project consists of widening of Florida's turnpike (SR 91) from four to eight lanes between Beulah Road and State Road 50 near milepost 272. The project also includes adding an additional lane in each direction on State Road 50, with capacity for future widening as well. The replacement of the bridges at Winter Garden-Vineland Road, Avalon Road and at State Road 50 is included. The interchange will be reconfigured to a diamond style, replacing the current partial-loop interchange and includes open road tolling (ORT) SunPass-only lanes. This project also includes the installation of noise abatement walls on Department right-of-way for qualifying property owners adjacent to the Turnpike. This project will be complete in the summer of 2012.

SUMTER COUNTY

ROADWAY RESURFACING PROJECT (MILEPOSTS 296-309)

- Be alert for lane closures associated with the ongoing daytime paving operation near the Turnpike's merge with Interstate 75.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This \$13.5 million resurfacing project, which began March 3, includes milling and resurfacing the roadway, including drainage and guardrail improvements, is nearing completion. Beachline West Expressway

BEE LINE WEST

WIDENING (Mileposts 4-8)

- Be alert for single lane closures, 10 p.m. to 6 a.m., Monday, January 5 through Friday, January 9.
- Watch for intermittent lane closures on Orange Avenue, the CSX overpass, and on Landstreet Road. Crews are working on the Beachline overpass bridge superstructure.
- **Jetport Drive will be closed to through traffic between South Orange Avenue and Boggy Creek Road, continuously, beginning at 11 p.m., Friday, January 9 and ending by 5 a.m., Monday, January 12. Local traffic will be allowed to enter and exit the businesses located along this stretch of Jetport. This closure is necessary to install drainage improvements. A detour is in place, routing traffic along Sand Lake Road between Boggy Creek Road and Orange Avenue.**
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PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is currently performing improvements to the Bee Line West Mainline Toll Plaza near Milepost 6. These improvements include open road tolling and widening the roadway

between the Turnpike and McCoy Road as part of a series of enhancements scheduled for construction over the next several years. The current project consists of the demolition and reconstruction of the existing mainline toll plaza with major capacity improvements and additional lanes.

Upon completion in the spring of 2009, the plaza will feature two SunPass-only express lanes in each direction, with the capacity to add an additional lane when the Beachline is widened to three lanes in each direction. With the added open road tolling feature, SunPass customers will be able to travel at highway speed in the express lanes.

Included in the toll plaza improvements is the construction of four mixed-use lanes to provide additional lanes for cash customers.

In June 2008, a \$49 million project began to widen the Beachline from the Turnpike (Milepost 4.3) to McCoy Road. Improvements include widening the existing bridge structures at US 441, Landstreet Road, CSX Railroad, CSX Railroad Taft Yard, Orange Avenue and McCoy Road. A new bridge will also be constructed for the access ramp over the CSX Railroad.

SEMINOLE EXPRESSWAY

LAKE JESUP TOLL PLAZA RECONSTRUCTION (Milepost 47)

- Watch for overnight lane closures in both directions near the mainline toll plaza nightly from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Florida's Turnpike Enterprise has begun a project to convert the Lake Jesup mainline toll plaza to open road tolling. This \$40.5 million project consists of the demolition and reconstruction of the existing mainline toll plaza with major capacity improvements and additional lanes.

Regional Projects

POLK COUNTY

TOLL ROAD 570—THE POLK PARKWAY

SUNPASS TOLL PLAZA CONVERSION PROJECT (Mileposts 0-18)

- The outside lanes remain closed at all ramp plazas from Airport Rd. to Old Dixie Hwy, with the exception of South Florida Avenue and Lakeland Highlands Road.
- Thermoplastic striping and delineator installation will continue next week at all ramp plazas.
- Be alert for lane closures on westbound inside lane, and on the SR 540 westbound on-ramp, 7 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday, January 18. Crews are removing the cantilever sign structure.
- Be prepared for a rolling, traffic pacing operation, overnight, January 19, westbound between mileposts 19-12. The on-ramps at Old Dixie Highway, US 92 and State Road 540 will be closed temporarily during this operation. Motorists should expect intermittent, rolling closures of up to one-half hour at a time. This operation accommodates installation of a new overhead sign structure.
- Watch for single lane closures, westbound at Milepost 13, 7 p.m. to 5 a.m., Tuesday, January 20.
- Be alert for single lane closures, eastbound at Milepost 12, 7 p.m. to 5 a.m., Wednesday, January 21.
- Prepare for single lane closures on the eastbound exit ramp at Warning Road, 7 p.m. to 5 a.m., Thursday, January 22. Motorists should use the Airport Road exit instead.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Florida's Turnpike began on March 10 a project to add SunPass-only lanes at the ramp toll plazas. Crews are completing final installation of sign panels and new SunPass-only lane equipment

This \$3.2 million project is scheduled for completion in February 2009.

TOLL ROAD 589—THE SUNCOAST PARKWAY

ITS IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

- Be alert for a rolling traffic pacing operation, northbound between mileposts 43-44 beginning at midnight, January 11. Crews are hanging an overhead sign structure.



Florida's Turnpike Enterprise, part of the Florida Department of Transportation, oversees a 460-mile system of limited-access toll highways: Florida's Turnpike, extending north from Homestead in Miami-Dade County to Wildwood in Sumter County; the Seminole Expressway and Southern Connector (Toll 417) in Seminole, Orange and Osceola counties; the Beachline Expressway West (Toll 528) in Orange County; the Polk Parkway (Toll 570) in Polk County; the Veterans Expressway and Suncoast Parkway in Hillsborough, Pasco and Hernando counties (Toll 589); the Sawgrass Expressway (Toll 869) in Broward County; and the southern 11 miles of the Daniel Webster Western Beltway (Toll 429) in Orange and Osceola Counties.
