Florida's Turnpike Enterprise to Host Public Hearing for the Design of Suncoast Parkway 2 (SR 589), Phase 2 from SR 44 to CR 486 in Citrus County

OCOEE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE) will hold a Public Hearing for the Design of the Suncoast Parkway 2 (SR 589), Phase 2, from SR 44 to CR 486 in Citrus County (Financial Project Identification Number 442764-1).

The Public Hearing will be held at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, December 8, 2020, with an informal open house. A formal presentation will begin promptly at 6:00 p.m. followed by a public comment period. Those interested may attend in-person at the Citrus County Fairgrounds Auditorium, located at 3600 S. Florida Avenue, Inverness, FL 34450. Other persons may attend virtually/online via a computer, tablet, smartphone, or by telephone in listen-only mode. All attendees will participate in the same live virtual Public Hearing.
