Florida's Turnpike Enterprise to Host Alternatives Public Information Meeting for the Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study of Florida's Turnpike (SR 91) Widening from south of I-595 to Wiles Road in Broward County

Ocoee, Fla. — The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE) will hold an Alternatives Public Information Meeting for the **Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for Florida's Turnpike (SR 91) from south of I-595 to Wiles Road in Broward County (Financial Project Identification Number 442212-1)**.

The Alternatives Public Information Meeting will be held at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, January 18, 2022 (virtual), and at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, January 19, 2022 (in-person).

If the in-person meeting cannot be held on **January 19, 2022**, due to severe weather or unforeseen conditions, it will be held on the alternate date of February 2, 2022, at the same time and place.
