



Turnpike Opens New Ramps Connecting to and from I-4 Express Lanes

On Saturday, February 26, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE) opened new ramps at Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 that directly connect to and from the new managed lanes on Interstate 4 (I-4), known as I-4 Express.

Drivers traveling northbound on Florida's Turnpike have the option to enter the new eastbound I-4 express lanes by taking the *left exit* ("I-4 East Express Lane Entrance"). The first accessible exit from I-4 Express is Kaley Avenue. Those wishing to exit at Conroy Road, John Young Parkway and U.S. 441 (Orange Blossom Trail) should not use I-4 Express. To access the I-4 general use lanes, drivers will need to continue using Exit 259 on the right. (See map below).

To access Florida's Turnpike southbound from the I-4 West Express Lanes, drivers will use the "Express Exit South Turnpike."

There is no additional toll on Florida's Turnpike to enter/exit I-4 Express.

All tolls on I-4 Express are collected electronically so drivers must have an active transponder. Drivers without an active transponder are subject to a \$25 toll violation, plus the cost of tolls. Since electronic tolls are collected at highway speed, there is no need to slow down when driving under an overhead gantry.

<u>SunPass</u> is the official transponder of I-4 Express. Other accepted transponders are: E-Pass, E-ZPass, LeeWay, NC QuickPass and Peach Pass. For more information about I-4 Express, please visit <u>I4Express.com</u>.
