PROJECT OVERVIEW


The Kissimmee Park Road TSM&O (Transportation Systems Management & Operations) Interim Improvements project represents interim improvements to the existing interchange at Florida's Turnpike (SR 91) and Kissimmee Park Road, located near St. Cloud in Osceola County. The project is proposed to help alleviate current operational issues with the existing interchange until the ultimate solution, relocation of the existing interchange to an extension of Nolte Road and closing of the Kissimmee Park Road interchange, is completed.

The proposed interim improvements include modifying the existing Florida Turnpike southbound off-ramp to Kissimmee Park Road and closing the median opening from eastbound Kissimmee Park Road traffic to the northbound Turnpike on-ramp. A dedicated U-turn and corresponding traffic signal on Old Canoe Creek Road at the St. Cloud Fire Station will be added.

KEY PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

The project will:

- Provide dual left turns from the southbound Turnpike off-ramp to Kissimmee Park Road.
- Close the median opening for eastbound Kissimmee Park Road to northbound Turnpike on-ramp.
- Provide a dedicated U-turn on Old Canoe Creek Road at the St. Cloud Fire Station location for Kissimmee Park Road traffic to access northbound Turnpike.


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TITLE VI/NON-DISCRIMINATION PROGRAM - POLICY STATEMENT
