



UPDATED: Closures at Florida's Turnpike and NW 199 Street/Stadium Interchange for the 2022 Formula 1 Miami Grand Prix



Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE) announces daily full closures of the northbound and southbound Florida's Turnpike/State Road (SR) 91 exit ramps to NW 199 Street/Hard Rock Stadium (Exit 2X) and the southbound Florida's Turnpike entrance ramp from Hard Rock Stadium, in Miami-Dade County.

Traffic will be detoured during the following dates and times:

- Daytime full ramp closure, 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m., Thursday, May 5.
- Daytime full ramp closure, 9:30 a.m. to 9:45 p.m., Friday, May 6.
- Daytime full ramp closure, 5 a.m. to 10:15 p.m., Saturday, May 7.
- Daytime full ramp closure, 6:15 a.m. to 7:15 p.m., Sunday, May 8.

Northbound and southbound Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 exit ramps to NW 199 Street/Stadium (Exit 2X)

Detour Information:

- Northbound Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 traffic wishing to access NW 199 Street/Stadium (Exit 2X) will be directed to exit at University Drive/NW 27 Avenue/SR 817 (Exit 47) and travel south on NW 27 Avenue to access NW 199 Street.
- Southbound Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 traffic wishing to access NW 199 Street/Stadium (Exit 2X) will be directed to exit at University Drive/NW 27 Avenue/SR 817 (Exit 47) and travel south on NW 27 Avenue to access NW 199 Street.

Detour Information:

- Stadium traffic wishing to access southbound Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 will be directed to NW 199 Street and travel east on NW 199 Street to access southbound Florida's Turnpike.
