



Public Hearing Announcement

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (Enterprise), is conducting a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for widening Florida's Turnpike (SR 91) from south of SR 408 to SR 50 (Milepost 263 to 273) in Orange County. The study is evaluating existing and future traffic conditions to determine the need and type of improvements for approximately 10 miles of Florida's Turnpike. The community is invited to participate in a Public Hearing about the project using one of the three following options:

Option 1: Virtually/online via a computer, tablet, smartphone on **Tuesday, February 28, 2023.**

Option 2: By telephone in listen-only mode on **Tuesday, February 28, 2023.**

Option 3: In person at Florida's Turnpike Headquarters located at Florida's Turnpike Milepost 263, Turkey Lake Service Plaza, Building 5315, Ocoee, Florida 34761 on **Thursday, March 2, 2023.**

The Public Hearing will begin at 5:30 p.m. and include a formal presentation followed by a public comment period. Please visit the project website, www.Turnpike408to50.com, to register for the Public Hearing and to select your participation option. **Please note that registration works best in Google Chrome, Microsoft Edge, or Firefox web browsers.** The same information will be provided in each participation option. Please contact the Project Manager for assistance in registering.

Once registered, you will receive a confirmation email including instructions on how to join the Public Hearing online. During registration you will be asked if you want to make a verbal statement during the formal comment period. If you desire to make a verbal statement, your microphone will be unmuted by the hearing moderator at the appropriate time. Any questions will receive a response in writing at a later date. We are using the GoToWebinar platform for the online option. Please review the Public Hearing exhibits on the project website in advance of the Public Hearing. The Public Hearing webinar will begin at 5:30 p.m. with a formal presentation and informational video, followed by the formal comment period. OPTION 2: BY TELEPHONE – Tuesday, February 28, 2023, 5:30 p.m.

To join the Public Hearing in listen-only mode, please call 914-614-3426 and enter access code 381-082-736. Please review the Public Hearing exhibits on the project website in advance of the hearing. The line will open at 5:30 p.m. with a formal presentation and informational video, followed by the formal comment period, which is limited to statements only. Any questions will receive a response in writing at a later date. You can provide comments directly to the Project Manager, Michael Leo, before or after the Public Hearing.

OPTION 3: IN PERSON – Thursday, March 2, 2023, 5:30 p.m.

Attend in-person at Florida's Turnpike Headquarters located at Florida's Turnpike Milepost 263, Turkey Lake Service Plaza, Building 5315, Ocoee, Florida 34761. During registration, you will be asked if you want to make a verbal statement during the public comment period; you can also request to speak at the venue. If you desire to make a verbal statement, you will be called to a microphone by the hearing moderator at the appropriate time. Any questions will receive a response in writing at a later date. You will also be able to provide your verbal statements directly to a court reporter. The doors will open at 5:30 p.m. for review of the presentation boards and project documents. The formal Public Hearing will begin at 6:00 p.m. followed by the formal comment period.

Proposed Improvements

Florida's Turnpike currently has a total of eight to 12 lanes (four through lanes and one to two auxiliary lanes in each direction), within the study limits.

The preferred alternative includes widening the Turnpike to provide five mainline travel lanes in each direction. Between SR 408 and SR 429, there would be additional "collector-distributor" (CD) lanes next to and separated from the mainline lanes to exclusively accommodate local traffic between the interchanges.

The proposed improvements are needed to accommodate expected traffic volumes through the year 2045 and are expected to:

- enhance safety
- accommodate travel demands
- improve travel time reliability
- improve system linkage
- enhance and maintain Central Florida's economic and employment viability, and
- enhance and maintain emergency response and evacuation.

The public hearing will provide an opportunity for the community to learn more about the preferred alternative and provide input. No decisions will be made until after the Public Hearing.
