Public Information Meeting Notice

Florida's Turnpike Enterprise to Host Public Information Meeting for SR 407/Challenger Memorial Parkway Roadway Access Classification change in Brevard County

Ocoee, FL — The Florida Department of Transportation, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise will hold a Public Information Meeting for a proposed access classification change of **SR 407 from I-95 to SR 405 from Access Classification 1 to Access Classification 4 in Brevard County, Florida**. The proposed change will provide consistency between the roadway characteristics and the roadway access classification type. It will allow for at-grade intersections on the roadway consistent with the proposed access classification.

The Public Information Meeting will be held at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 21, 2023 (virtual), and at 5:30 p.m. Thursday, March 23, 2023 (in-person).
