Florida's Turnpike Enterprise to Host a Public Hearing for the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study to Widen Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 from South of SR 408 to SR 50 (Milepost 263 - 273) in Orange County, Florida

**Ocoee, Fla.** — The Florida Department of Transportation, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise will hold a Public Hearing for the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study to Widen Florida's Turnpike/SR 91 from south of SR 408 to SR 50 in Orange County (Financial Project Identification Number 444007-1).

The Public Hearing will be held on **Monday, August 7, 2023**, at 12 p.m. (virtually) and at 5:30 p.m. (in-person).

Interested persons may participate in the Public Hearing in the following ways:

- Virtually from a computer, tablet, or phone on Monday, August 7, 2023, at 12 p.m. Participants attending virtually may join the Public Hearing in listen-only mode by calling (914) 614-3426 and entering the access code 381-082-736 when prompted; or
- 2) In-person by going to Florida's Turnpike Headquarters, located at Florida's Turnpike Milepost 263, Turkey Lake Service Plaza, Building 5315, Ocoee, Florida 34761 on **Monday, August 7, 2023.** The in-person hearing will begin with an open house at 5:30 p.m. A formal presentation will begin at 6 pm., followed by a public comment period. If the in-person Public Hearing cannot be held on August 7, 2023, due to severe weather or unforeseen conditions, it will be held on the alternate date of September 7, 2023, at the same time and place.
