OCOOE, FL — The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Florida's Turnpike Enterprise will hold a Public Information Meeting for the design of the **Sawgrass Expressway (SR 869) Widening and Interchange Improvements from south of NW 8th Street to north of Commercial Boulevard (CR 870) in Broward County (Financial Project Identification Numbers 437155-1, 437155-5, 437155-6).**
