Florida's Turnpike Enterprise to Host Alternatives Public Information Meeting for the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for Florida's Turnpike (SR 91) Widening from North of SR 70 to North of SR 60 St. Lucie, Indian River, Okeechobee, and Osceola Counties, FL

**OCOEE, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise will hold an Alternatives Public Information Meeting for the project for the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for Florida's Turnpike (SR91) Widening from North of SR 70 to North of SR 60 IN St. Lucie, Indian River, Okeechobee, and Osceola Counties (Financial Project Identification Number 423374-2).
