*Florida's Turnpike Enterprise to Host Alternatives Public Information Meeting for the Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study of Suncoast Parkway (SR 589) Widening from south of Van Dyke Road to SR 52 in Hillsborough and Pasco Counties, FL*

**OCOE, Fla.** — The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Florida's Turnpike Enterprise will hold an Alternatives Public Information Meeting for the **Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for Suncoast Parkway (SR 589) from south of Van Dyke Road to SR 52 in Hillsborough and Pasco counties (Financial Project Identification Number 448068-1).**

**The Alternatives Public Information Meeting will be held at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, June 25, 2024 (virtual), and at 5:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 27, 2024 (in-person).**

The in-person meeting will be conducted in an informal open house format. If the in-person meeting cannot be held on June 27, 2024, due to severe weather or unforeseen conditions, it will be held on the alternate date of July 18, 2024, at the same time and place.
